Summary

The KCAASS scale was developed to assess the training needs and professional skills of staff working in sexuality rehabilitation with SCI patients. This scale utilizes a conceptual framework that highlights holistic and consumer-driven approaches to education.

The four subscales found within the questionnaire include knowledge (14 items), comfort (21 items), approach (5 items), and attitudes (5 items). Individual items are ranked on a four point scale, ranging from low to high.
