Summary scores for each of the four aspects of sexuality are calculated. Higher scores represent greater knowledge. A maximum composite score of 200 is obtained by summing up the subscales.

Summary

The Knowledge, Comfort, Approach and Attitude towards Sexuality Scale (KCAASS) was developed to assess the training needs and professional skills of staff working in sexuality rehabilitation with patients with SCI.

This scale utilizes a conceptual framework that highlights holistic and consumer-driven approaches to education.

The four subscales found within the questionnaire include knowledge (14 items), comfort (21 items), approach (5 items), and attitudes (5 items). Individual items are ranked on a four-point scale, ranging from low to high.
